Mood Indigo - the annual cultural festival of IIT Bombay, renowned to be Asia's Largest College Cultural Festival - is presently in its 50th edition. With over 240 events ranging from dramatics, dance, and music to glamorous professional concerts, Mood Indigo is widely considered as the hotbed of budding talent and the biggest meeting ground for over 1,46,000 students. This year it is a 2 day - 2-night extravaganza which will take place on 26th -27th December in a full virtual mode. Mood Indigo has been one of the Top 5 Festivals Worldwide under 'Best Relationship With Fans' as rated by FestX.

### **Idea for the record:**

Most number of people making paper cranes together (online): The idea of making paper cranes reference to the famous [Japanese Fable](#) about making 1000 paper cranes as a prayer to heal from disease and we'd be making paper cranes as a prayer to heal from Coronavirus.

**Procedure:**

1. The participating school will be required to fill the confirmation form (link provided above) and provide the details of the Point of Contacts (PoCs) to whom all the information will be passed on.
2. The PoCs will be contacted by our team and they will be required to pass all the information to the students.
3. For making the record we are building a website on which all the students taking part in the record will have to register and the link to the website will be shared with the PoCs by 13th December.
4. The PoCs will be provided with the link to a youtube video and a PDF, both explaining how to make paper cranes by 13th December. The PoCs will be required to share the link of the website as well as the link of video and PDF with students.
5. These video links and PDF will also be accessible to students after they register on the website.
6. Students will be required to register on the website **before 18th December** and the expected event date is **20th December** (time will be conveyed soon)
7. On the date of the event, the students will need to go to the website and enter their details. On the website, the students will be able to see the live streaming of a video and the website will also record the live feed of their camera.
8. During the event, the students will be told the Japanese tale and the artist will also be demonstrating the making of paper cranes and at the same time students will have to make the paper cranes at that time (for making a paper crane a student need to only have a piece of paper preferably A4 size)
- 9. The students need to make the paper crane at the time of the event.**
10. After making the paper crane the students will be asked to click a photo of the paper crane they made and upload it on the website.

All the students will receive certificates for contributing in an attempt to create a world record.

**Important Dates:**

- 1. 13 December:** The PoCs will receive the PDF and links which they will be required to circulate among the students.
- 2. 18 December:** Last date for the student to register on the website.
- 3. 20 December:** Expected date of the event. The exact time of the event will be conveyed soon.

Please make sure that the students learn to make paper cranes before the date of the event. The PDF and link of the video will be provided for that purpose.
